Dr. Schnall is recognized as an expert in her field as evidenced by extensive consultation to federal agencies as a reviewer of grant submissions for funding through CDC, AHRQ, NIH, NIST and CIHR. Furthermore, she is committed to mentoring the next generation of nurse scientists and supporting diversity, equity and inclusion.
