Brigitte Séroussi

Brigitte Séroussi is a Professor of Biomedical Informatics at Sorbonne University in Paris, France. As a member of the Decision Support group of the LIMICS laboratory (UMRS 1142, Paris, France), her research work is centered on the modeling, the development, the implementation, and the evaluation of clinical decision support systems based on clinical practice guidelines. As a health practitioner, she is head of the Department of Public Health of the Tenon University Hospital (Assistance Publique – Hôpitaux de Paris, Paris, France), and she has been chairing the Board in charge of managing care quality and patient safety over the network of all Eastern Paris Hospitals (7 hospitals, 4,000 beds) since 2012. She is also working part-time at the Delegation for Digital Health (Délégation du Numérique en Santé) at the French Ministry of Health (the French equivalent of the US ONC) to define and

implement the strategy to promote nationwide adoption of Health Information Systems and Electronic Healthcare Records by hospitals, and care providers from private practice.

She has had an active role in various scientific conferences, in MEDINFO 2019 (Lyon, France) where she was part of the LOC and co-chair of the Editorial Committee, in STC and MIE conferences where she was chair or co-chair of the SPC. She is currently involved in different leadership positions: member of the EFMI council since 2011 (European Federation of Medical Informatics association), member of the Inaugural Class of IAHSI in 2017, and promoted as FACMI in 2019.

She has been serving as chief editor of the IMIA Yearbook of Medical Informatics from 2012 to 2016 when she became the Vice President for Services of IMIA until 2020. She managed the IMIA Yearbook together with a team of 30 persons (26 section editors, two per section, two chief editors, one person in charge of the management of candidate best papers, and the editorial assistant) in interaction with Schattauer then THIEME.
